The meeting was called to order and conducted by Col Jensen, Wing Commander. Chaplain Nortier delivered the Invocation.

Major Henry Lile reported safety information concerning the 15 passenger vans. He stated tire pressure should be checked before and after a major load of passengers. All are required to wear seat belts and all efforts should be made to avoid having excessive weight behind the rear axle. All passengers should be seated in the front of the van unless the van is full and when full the weight should be evenly balanced throughout the van. Extra caution should be taken when items are stored on the roof rack.

James Gilbert stated that the main problems with the vans are the inexperienced drivers. He has training available to those in need.

Robert Britton is the new Vice Commander.

Kenneth Weis is the new operations officer.

Faye Williams stated that the wing conference will be Oct 13th and 14th. There will be a non alcoholic Bar-B-Q and dance held here at CAP headquarters on the 13th and the seminars will possibly be held at the Doubletree Hotel. Room rates are projected to range from \$71.00 to \$101.00 depending on occupancy.
